

CONSTITUTION FOR SENIOR SCENE INC.

Revised September 2020

ARTICLE 1. NAME

The name of this corporation shall be the Senior Scene Inc. commonly called East Beaches Social Scene (and hereinafter referred to as the "Club").

ARTICLE 2. MISSION STATEMENT

The purpose of this corporation, in order to prevent isolation of seniors, shall be to provide an opportunity for seniors to learn, socialize, develop new skills, maintain a healthy lifestyle, and facilitate a working relationship with the community.

ARTICLE 3. LEGAL.

3.1 The Constitution and By-laws of the Senior Scene Inc. shall be binding on all members, committees and sub-committees of the Club.

3.2 Charitable status: The purposes for which this corporation is formed are within the meaning of the federal tax code.

ARTICLE 4. GOVERNANCE

The Club shall be governed by a Board of Directors and an Executive Committee as determined in the By-laws and consistent with all Provincial and Federal regulations that apply.

ARTICLE 5. DISSOLUTION

In the event of dissolution of the Club:

5.1 The Board of Directors may, at its discretion, dissolve the Corporation if the general membership believes it no longer serves the purposes as indicated in its Mission Statement.

5.2 All assets remaining after meeting outstanding liabilities shall be assigned to the Club to further be distributed to a fund, foundation, or non-profit organization(s) in the area whose objectives most closely accord with those of the Club agreed upon by the remaining membership.

5.3 No member shall hold any right to Club property.

ARTICLE 6. AMENDMENTS

6.1 Amendments to this constitution may be proposed either by the Board of Directors or by a petition of ten percent of the members in good standing and through a notice of motion at least 30 days prior to a vote at the Annual General Meeting.

Adoption of the amendments of the Constitution shall require a two-thirds vote of the members voting at an Annual General Meeting.

6.2 Amendments to the By-laws may be proposed by any member in good standing through a Notice of Motion at least 30 days prior to a vote. Adoption of amendments to the By-laws shall require a simple majority vote of the members voting at a regular meeting.
